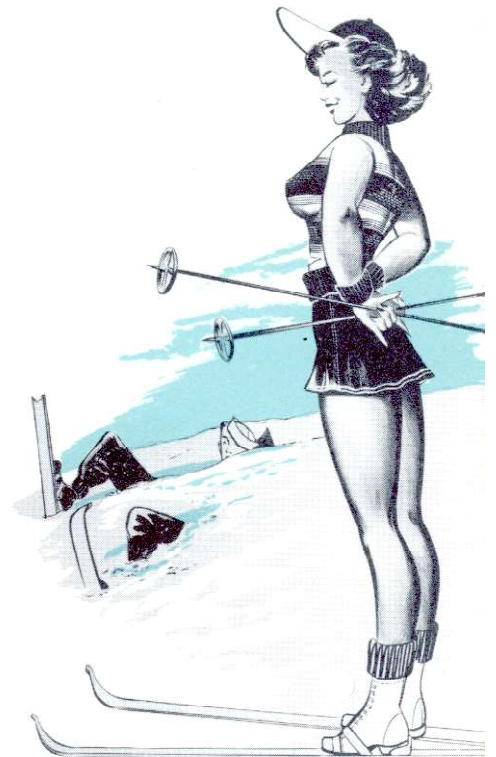
On an old man's shirt was written a sentence 'I am not 80 years old;
