GENERAL LAFAYETTE'S RETURN TO PORT DEPOSIT

On Tuesday, July 29, 2025, Port Deposit welcomed back one of its most distinguished historic guests, General Lafayette, precisely 200 years after his original visit in 1825. As part of the national commemoration of Lafayette's Farewell Tour (1824 to 1825), the American Friends of Lafayette brought a costumed interpreter to retrace the General's path, with Port Deposit as one of the celebrated stops.

In 1825, Lafayette briefly visited Port Deposit, taking refreshments at the Megredy House (now known as the Gerry House), before continuing his journey by steamboat to Baltimore. This year's bicentennial tribute honored that moment through the coordinated efforts of the Port Deposit Heritage Corporation, the Town of Port Deposit, and the Harford County Bicentennial Committee.

Despite sweltering temperatures over 100 degrees, residents and visitors gathered in the decorated Town Square to celebrate in full spirit. The Maryland Army National Guard Brass Band set the tone with period marches, providing a fitting backdrop for the day's tributes and proclamations.

Councilmember Berlin delivered a proclamation recognizing Lafayette's enduring contributions to the American Revolution and human rights. The Town officially designated July 29, 2025, as "Lafayette Day" in the Town of Port Deposit.

Several community organizations and vendors contributed to the day's success, including the Cecil County Public Library, Harmony Lodge of the Freemasons, Port Deposit Heritage Corporation, Community Connecting Us, and Jane Bellmeyr, who led a hands-on craft station where participants built traditional buzz saw, or Whirly-Gigs. The celebration continued with a "Lunch with Lafayette" hosted at Lee's Landing Dock Bar.

Following the meal, the General was escorted to the Lee's Landing dock where he boarded the Havre de Grace Susquehanna Fire Company boat. Port Deposit honored his departure with a four-cannon salute.

Did you know?

In 1670, 300 acres of land, known as "the Widow's Lot", was sold by John Hyde to Colonel John Creswell who ran a ferry there. The area was then known as "Creswell's Ferry". This property represents the north of Town Square.

Port Deposit Refuse and Recycle Service Casella Curbside Collection Guidelines

To ensure smooth and reliable collection, please follow these key quidelines:

- o Pickup Day: Monday. Place bins out the night before or by 6 AM; remove by 7 PM.
- o Trash & Recycling: Use Casella-provided containers only.

 Bags/recyclables must be inside containers with lids closed. Nothing left outside will be collected. Follow Cecil County guidelines for recycling.
- o Placement: Leave 3 ft clearance around bins; place on a level surface with lid opening facing street and 15 ft overhead clearance.
- o Container Colors: Recycling: Navy Blue w/ Light Blue Top, Light Blue w/ Black Top, Green w/ Black Top. Trash: Navy Blue w/ Black Top, Black w/ Green Top, Grey w/ Black Top.
- o Oversized/Additional Items: Call Casella at 1-800-227-3552 to schedule; do not place more than 24 hrs in advance. Fees billed to homeowner.
- o For missed collections or container issues, call Town Hall at 410-378-2121. Holiday/weather delays are posted on the Town's website and Facebook page.
